In anticipation of Nursing's 2000 Planning Conversation, several documents are attached:

Last year was a banner year for Nursing, particularly in the development of centers of excellence (see attached grids). Not only does Nursing contribute significantly to two centers embedded in the School of Medicine--Nursing provides the leadership for cancer control/care research in the NIH-funded Cancer Center; two associate directors (for research and for evaluation) of the National Center of Excellence in Women's Health are nursing faculty--, but the school has just been funded by NIH to establish a Center for Enhancing Quality of Life in Chronic Illness. For the second year in a row, external funding increased by 70%, making 1998-99 the first year in Nursing's history that "earned" income (tuition, grants, etc.) exceeded state appropriation as a revenue stream.

2000 Planning Goals

The five key goals of 1999 remain the primary goals of 2000, with the indicators of progress expected to be about the same. *The* chronic challenge is the relatively poor compensation of nursing faculty in comparison to their peers. Therefore, equity adjustment monies are once again requested to partially redress this problem (\$50,000 plus associated fringes), which remains a major morale issue as the overall performance of the school approaches “top ten” functioning. The futuristic need is for base monies to hire two new faculty (\$150,000 plus associated fringes) who will further “grow” the research base, so necessary now that we have an NIH-funded Center, and consequently “grow” our number of doctoral students, so important to IUPUI’s achieving Carnegie I status. One of these appointments will be a minority faculty member to guarantee that minority health concerns are spotlighted within our research program.

LEARNING

- ◆ Financial support of undergraduates was increased through LET’S DO IT (Linking Excited Tech Students to Diverse Opportunities at IUPUI for tomorrow); Helene Fuld monies were

obtained to facilitate RN-MSN mobility

- ◆ The MSN in Nursing Administration was re-designed in terms of problem-based learning
- ◆ Doctoral student, Usha Menon, won a prestigious Jonathan Edwards Fellowship; Judy Williams was honored as best PhD student at the Chancellor's 1999 Convocation
- ◆ Nursing faculty received many teaching awards, e.g., Pam Jeffries received the 1999 Lucile Petry Leone Award of the National League for Nursing and the Region IV Information Technology Award of Sigma Theta Tau International; Diane Billings received the Founder's Award for Educational Excellence at the 1999 biennial convention of Sigma Theta Tau International; Karen Cobb and Enid Zwirn were selected for FACET; Mary Beth Riner and Barbara Ross received the Sequoia Award for teaching cultural diversity

RESPONSIBILITIES OF EXCELLENCE

- ◆ Nursing at IUPUI was ranked 12th for its master's program by *U. S. News & World Report*, and was one of only 12 nursing schools to have an NIH institutional research training grant
- ◆ External funding topped \$7 million in 1998-99, up 70% from 1997-98
- ◆ Nursing faculty were recognized for their scholarship, e.g., Joan Austin was promoted to the rank of Distinguished Professor and also received the award for Social Accomplishment from the Executive Committees of the International Bureau for Epilepsy and the International League Against Epilepsy; Phyllis Stern received the 1999 Glenn W. Irwin, Jr. Award in acknowledgment of her contributions to women's health; Tammy Bakas received the New Investigator Award of the Midwest Nursing Research Society's Gerontology Research Section; Janet Welch received the New Investigator Award of the Midwest Nursing Research Society's Qualitative Research Section

- ◆ As a university school, IUSON utilized 282 clinical/community teaching sites in 1998-99

Silver Award of the National Association of Pediatric Nurse Practitioners; Linda Finke was honored by the Association of Child & Adolescent Psychiatric Nurses and the International Society of Psychiatric-Mental Health Nurses; Beverly Richards received the American Psychiatric Nurses Association's Award for Excellence in Practice; Dixie Ray received the Jerry King Honorary Leadership Award from the Near East Side Community Organization; Enid Zwirn received the Mayor's Volunteer Partnership Award

- ◆ Victoria Champion received one of the first awards presented by the Walther Cancer Institute for promoting multi-disciplinary research collaboration

SCHOLARSHIP OF UTILIZATION

Community Health

- IARCH's WHO Collaborating Center status was renewed for another 5 years.
- In 1998-99, IUSON received over \$4.5 million in grants/contracts bearing on community health.
